We will be renovating various classrooms this holiday and we will also be completing a new 'state of the art' Science Laboratory which will be used by the entire school. The School Board has also given the go-ahead for the architect to draw up the first sketches for, what we will be calling, the IMAD Centre. This building will house the new Prep IT Centre, a new facility for Drama, Art and Music in both schools and a state of the art 250-seat theatre and performance facility. This is certainly an exciting project and one which I am sure is going to capture the imagination of many in our community. I, for one, am excited about what it is going to do for the young men and women of Oakhill: it will be a facility where they will be challenged and extended to reach beyond themselves. Lastly, we will be refurbishing Barbie's old office which will be converted into our new sanatorium and Rose Solomon will be moving there to tend to all the medical needs of students and staff. This will certainly be a more comfortable space for Rose to deal with bumps, scrapes and medical emergencies and we will have it clearly sign posted for all to see by the start of the new term.

There are many small projects that Philip Stewart and his Grounds and Maintenance team continue to deal with and I am sure you will agree that our gardens and buildings look magnificent at the moment.
