This exam is benchmarked internationally and as a result our Matrics are eligible to apply to any University in the world. In fact we have a number of students studying abroad at the present time. Most Oakhill students study at South African Universities, the favourites being UCT, and Stellenbosch. All of them thrive in this environment simply because they have been encouraged to be critical thinkers in our rigorous academic environment.

Oakhill has a proud Matric record and has averages in every subject which are comparable to the National IEB average.

As can be seen from the table above we continue to improve our distinctions per candidate year on year. We have also improved our conversion rate of 'B' symbols to 'A' symbols but need to focus on converting even more. What is encouraging is that **74% of our candidates received at least one 'A' symbol**. 50% received two or more, 29% received three or more and 24% of students received 4 or more distinctions. This certainly gives future matriculants and their parents the assurance that, should their children put in the effort they are capable of achieving the results they deserve at Oakhill.
