

Oakhill School Sports Facilities Investment Upgrade

It has been just over six years since Oakhill School purchased 17 hectares of land in the rural suburb of Welbedacht as its first step in developing world-class sporting facilities for its pupils.

We have used the forced gap in sporting activity due to Covid-19 to review our offering and update our strategy for the next five years. One of the outcomes from this review was to introduce a tiered structure for our sports. Our aim is to invest in upgrading our facilities for our Tier I (water polo and hockey) and Tier 2 (netball, tennis, cricket, rugby and soccer) offerings.

There are four designated projects which we are extremely excited to get off the ground this year:

- I. The deepening of the swimming pool on our school campus to allow us to host water polo matches
- 2. The construction of multi-purpose courts for tennis and netball at our Oakhill Sports Campus (OSC)
 - 3. The construction of a dam for water harvesting and water polo training at the OSC
- 4. Additional sports storage, gazebo and technical area alongside the existing cricket nets at the OSC

The modifications to the existing clubhouse at the OSC have already been completed this year. The extended roof with paving provides additional covered seating and shelter from the elements.

Short-term Project WATER POLO POOL

Water polo is the premier summer sport at Oakhill and certainly the one sport, in addition to hockey, where Oakhill holds its own against any school in the country. In 2019, pre-Covid, Oakhill sported ten water polo sides across both Prep and College, with over 20 pupils selected for provincial teams and two College pupils selected for the national training squad. Our annual Chukka Festivals are a highlight among schools across the country and attract over 40 teams and countless spectators who travel to Knysna to participate in these festivals.

Without a suitable water polo pool, our competitive water polo games have historically been played in the Knysna estuary. The upgrade to our current swimming pool on the school campus will enable us to continue to grow our water polo legacy well into the future.




