15 other students received either one or two subject distinctions.



Oakhill Trends: Distinctions per candidate since 2008


The average distinctions per candidate and the three-year averages can be seen in the graph below. This is a valuable tool for Oakhill to track achievement trends. It is pertinent to note that the class of 2022 achieved extremely well (blue line). The orange line shows the 15-year average (since 2008) and sits at 1.98 distinctions per candidate. Also of interest is the three-year moving average (red line) which indicates that an upward trend in the number of distinctions per candidate has been achieved in 2022. In fact, the Matric group of 2022 managed the second-most distinctions per candidate since 2008.
